Mrs. Jaroszlava Khartyanyi was elected President of the World Federation of Ukrainian Women's Organizations in October 2023. She serves as the Second Vice-President of the Ukrainian World Congress and Deputy Chair of the European Congress of Ukrainians. Jaroszlava has authored several historical publications and documentaries on the topic of the Holodomor of 1932-1933 in Ukraine. In recognition of her work for the Ukrainian community, Mrs. Khartyanyi has received numerous awards from the government of Ukraine, among them the Order of Princess Olga, II Class (2001), the Order of Princess Olga, II Class (2006), and the Order of Princess Olga, I Class (2009). Mrs. Khartyanyi graduated from Terebovlya Cultural and Educational College in Ternopil oblast (Ukraine, 1976) and the Faculty of History at the Eötvös Loránd University, Budapest (Hungary, 1987).
